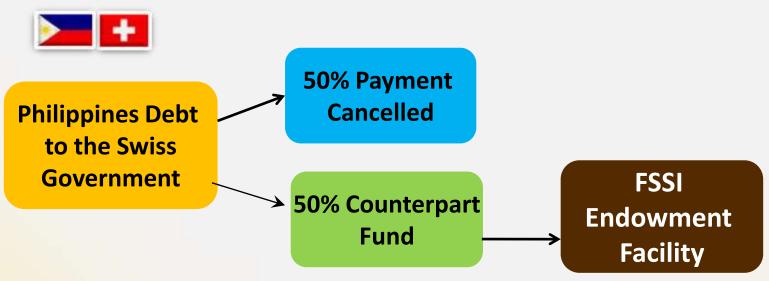

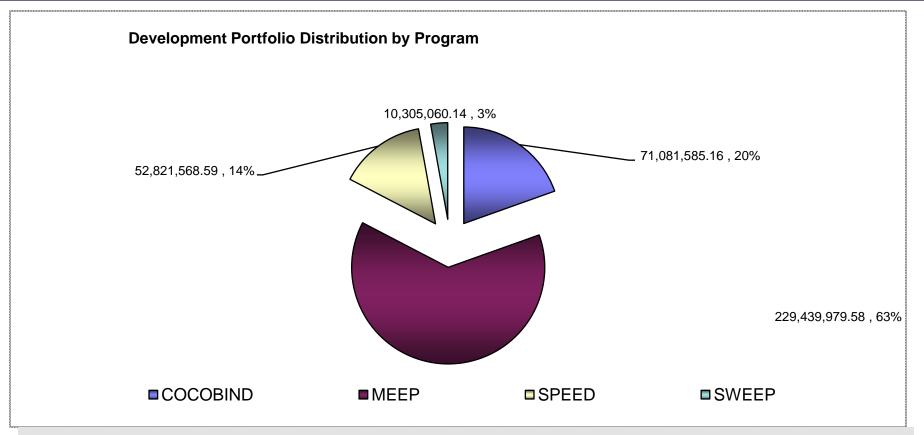
Our Network



Past Program Focus (2004-2010)

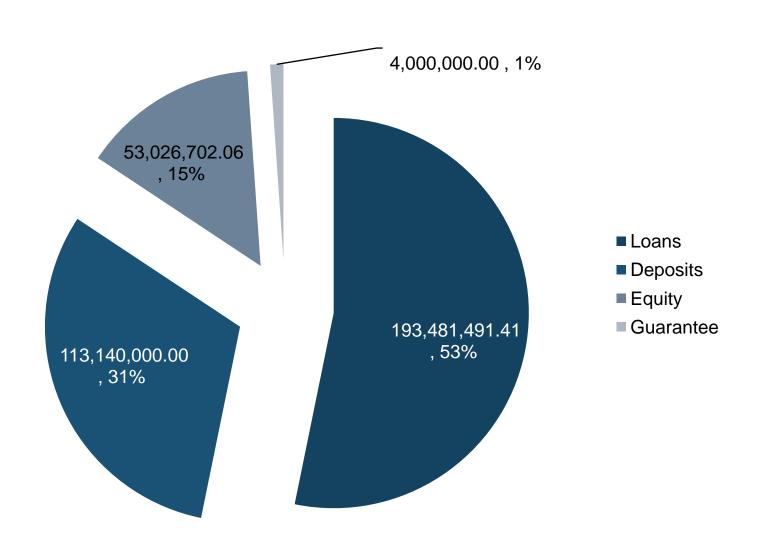

Eco-Entrepreneurship



Community-based enterprises that promotes local economy development



SOCIAL EQUITY

Opportunities for strengthening governance, management capacity and competence of community members to engage in productive enterprises;

Participation of locals and various sectors (women, farmers, workers, fisherfolk) in the actual project operation through sustainable gainful employment or access to capital or productive assets such as savings or capital build-up;

Opportunities for gaining control and ownership of productive enterprises through equitable distribution and sharing of resources and earnings.

ECOLOGICALLY SOUND

At the very least, it is environmentally benign

Provides opportunity for (if not yet directly employing) cleaner and sustainable production systems

Provides for a safe, healthy and favorable work environment

Enhances, protects or rehabilitates the environment

ECONOMIC VIABILITY

Presence of a clear and viable financial plan involving commercial viability criteria

Strong market demand and/or prospects for expansion of the business/project

Appropriateness and effectiveness of management structure

Effectiveness of technology employed

ENTRY & PARTICIPATION OF THE POOR: Will it involve a significant number of marginalized communities? Will it facilitate access to new knowledge, skills or technology

BENEFITS TO THE POOR: Can they derived gainful employment? Does it promote fair labor practices? Can it facilitate equal access to social goods & services

OWNERSHIP & CONTROL: Is there opportunity for participation in decision-making, for equitable distribution and sharing of resources, for access to productive assets?

TECHNOLOGY/PRODUCTION PROCESS: Are the raw materials needed renewable? What environmental impacts are created (waste/pollution, energy, water)? Can it be mitigated? What systems can be integrated to reduce environmental impacts?

REGULATORY SYSTEM: Does the market system recognizes impacts to the environment? Are there resources, standards or legislations needed to improve environmental performance of enterprises in the sub-sector?

PRODUCT USE: Can the product be used to protect or enhance the environment? Is the market willing to pay premium or value for environmental protection? If not, what can be done?

VALUE CREATION: Where do we create the highest economic value in the chain?

MARKET SYSTEM: What is the prevailing rules of the game? Who are the players? Is the market efficient? Is it democratic or does it perpetuate inequity? Does it destroy or enhance the environment?

ENABLING ENVIRONMENT: Policy environment; barriers to entry & exit, research & technological support, financial investments

INTERNAL COMPETENCIES: Capital, entrepreneurial ability, labor supply, etc
