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AWAKENING HOPE

- Cynical reversal of our highest aspirations
- Sense of betrayal, retreat into self-absorption, indifference, cynicism
- Easy to promise change, more difficult for people to believe
- Basic requirements:
 - Leaders of integrity armed with a legitimate democratic mandate
 - A platform of action based on an acknowledgment of our basic problems
 - A citizenry that can be inspired to be active participants in change

- 3. BALLOONING PUBLIC DEBT AND THE MISUSE OFPUBLIC FUNDS

- N. SYSTEMATIC VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND FAILURE OF THE JUSTICE SYSTEM
- 2. THE ELUSIVENESS OF A JUST AND LASTING PEACE, ESPECIALLY IN MINDANAO
- 3. WORSENING ORGANIZED CRIME AND THE PROLIFERATION OF ARMED GROUPS

- FAILURE TO CHART A LONG-TERM FOREIGN POLICY DIRECTION APPROPRIATE TO A SELF-RELIANT NATION
- GROSS NEGLECT OF OUR PEOPLE'S CULTURE AND HERITAGE WHICH HAS LED TO THE FURTHER WEAKENING OF FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES

3 MAIN PRIORITIES

REDUCING THE BURDEN OF POVERTY AND DEVELOPING OUR HUMAN RESOURCES

- □ Despite touted economic growth, the number of poor people has steadily increased (30% in 2003 32.9% in 2006) or from 23.8M to 27.6M.
- □ In 2008 self-rated poverty ranged from 50-59%
- Dismal performance in poverty reduction compared to East Asian countries

REDUCING THE BURDEN OF POVERTY AND DEVELOPING OUR HUMAN RESOURCES

- Expansion of the Conditional Cash Transfer (CCT) Program after improving on the targeting mechanism
- Universal PhilHealth coverage upon presentation of a valid NSO certificate especially the 7 most depressed regions (ARMM, Zamboanga, Samar-Leyte, Bicol, MIMAROPA, SOCSARGEN, Agusan-Surigao)
- 12-year basic education

REDUCING THE BURDEN OF POVERTY AND DEVELOPING OUR HUMAN RESOURCES

- Job generation, initially by small scale, labor intensive agricultural and urban development projects
- Hasten land tenure improvement by prioritizing the largest landholdings where would-be beneficiaries are organized, asking for coverage and prepared to work with each other
- Delineate the final forest line to arrest the further decline of forest cover

REBUILDING PEOPLE'S TRUST IN GOVERNMENT AND STRENGTHENING DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS

Transparency mechanisms

- Curtail public displays of power, i.e., excessive security escorts and "wangwang"
- No wastage of resources for signages attributing projects to government officials
- Issue an executive order ensuring freedom of information
- Package budget information for the media and post all transactions on the DBM website

REBUILDING PEOPLE'S TRUST IN GOVERNMENT AND STRENGTHENING DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS

- People empowerment through enlisting the support of citizens in
 - Monitoring government projects
 - Reporting feedback through the most accessible means, i.e., SMS, internet, etc.
 - Involving the people in the design of projects similar to KALAHI-CIDSS
 - Undertaking small steps to instill discipline and the rule of law, like Singapore's no spitting
 - Implement people's participation mechanisms already enshrined in law

REBUILDING PEOPLE'S TRUST IN GOVERNMENT AND STRENGTHENING DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS

- Strengthening the career service
 - Eligibilities and qualification standards
 - Delegate the appointing authority of the President to Cabinet Secretaries below Assec
 - Abide by the legally provided plantilla of positions
 - Stop practices that undermine professionalism like "desire letters" and appointments in acting capacity
 - Review all midnight appointments to both the career and non-career service
 - Institute a measurable performance management system at all levels of government

- No real political parties to speak of
- Leadership devoid of direction --- personality, not platform-based
- The erosion of the standards of leadership ---popularity and name recall, patronage and accessibility
- Self-interest above service
- Leaders with negotiable virtues

- Poverty and disparities in wealth, power and opportunity
- Cynicism and suspicion formed due to years of failed expectations
- CSOs schooled in opposition
- Proven capacity for volunteerism
- The need to convert the volunteers mobilized for electoral victory into a force that can be a partner for sustained reform

- Victory without majority
- The burden of extremely high and immediate expectations
- Getting their act together
